### More than 90% of healthcare workers have experienced violence

That's according to a new survey from Perceptyx, which noted the violence came from a patient or a patient's caregiver in the past month for 9 in 10 survey respondents. Another 3 in 4 respondents have encountered both verbal and physical assaults in the month, and nearly half of workers called for security or another coworker to assist.

## Lawmakers hope to expand community mental health clinic services

Sens. Debbie Stabenow, D-Mich., and Roy Blunt, R-Mo., have proposed expanding the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics program nationwide to widen access to behavioral health and substance use services, especially for the most vulnerable. "This approach is already changing people's lives -- and saving communities money -- in the states where mental health and addiction treatment are funded the same way as other health care," the senators wrote.
